IITC 2005 encourages proposals for workshops/tutorials that are of broad interest across the ICT community. Proposed workshop may be half-day, full-day, or two days.

The deadline for submission of proposals for workshops/tutorials is **15th August 2005**,

## **What should a proposal look like?**

Workshop/tutorials proposals should be submitted using the workshop/tutorials proposal form or sent in MS Word or *pdf* format to the workshop chair, and they should consist of four pages/parts :

### **Cover Page**

*Category of Proposal (Tutorial/Workshop)*

*Name of the proposed workshop/tutorial.*

*Names and addresses of the organizers.*

*Target Audience*

*Intended number of participants.*

*Requested Audio/Video equipment.*

**Abstract**

Why it is relevant to IITC2005 and a short overview of the rationale for the workshop/tutorials and the major topics to be addressed.

The abstract should preferably not exceed 200 words.

All proposals will be reviewed by the IITC Workshop/tutorials Committee.

**Eligibility:**

The proposed topics must be of broad interest across the ICT community and workshop/tutorials shall be open to all institutions. Presenters must have a proven track record preferably with prior experience in delivering similar workshops or tutorials.

**Budget:**

IITC will provide support for expenses such as stipend and travel expenses for the resource person(s), facilities rental, meals during the event, materials for the workshop/tutorials.
